## LaKoya Gardner

Director of Mays Family Institute on Diverse Philanthropy

IU Lilly Family School of Philanthropy

LaKoya Gardner is the Inaugural Director of the Mays Family Institute on Diverse Philanthropy located at the Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy, which is the world's first school dedicated to increasing the understanding of philanthropy and improving its practice worldwide. The core mission of the Mays Family Institute is to understand the perceptions, practices, experiences, and needs of the individuals and institutions that operationalize philanthropy in underrepresented communities and develop programming and services to engage philanthropic practitioners, scholars, and the public at large in conversations and activities to advance this field.

LaKoya speaks across the globe on issues related to national and international trends in diversity and philanthropy. She has pioneered new approaches and programs, such as the NCAA Foundations of Fundraising, United Negro College Fund Philanthropy Institute, and the "Athlete to Advocate Executive Certificate", just to name a few. The Athlete to Advocate program allows her to provide training to professional athletes to help enhance their philanthropic activities as well as their communication and advocacy skills through their unique platform as professional athletes, all while helping them target and alleviate social injustices and inequalities.

Most recently, LaKoya was a co-author of the fifth edition of "Achieving Excellence in Fundraising," which is the leading fundraising textbook based on research and steeped in practical expertise.

LaKoya has over 17 years of experience in fundraising within higher education and numerous nonprofit organizations. Prior to her position at the Mays Family Institute, she raised over \$14.7M within a 3-year timespan as the Executive Director of Resource Development at Ivy Tech Community College located in Indiana.

LaKoya received her Bachelor of Arts from Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis. (IUPUI), and her Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership from Indiana Wesleyan. Her focus area is to continue utilizing her expertise in fundraising to expand the understanding of donors of color and other underrepresented donors to shift the narrative within the field of philanthropy.
